A Destructive Cyclone Sweeps the Plains of Colorado East of Denver.**PEOPLE COMPELLED TO FLEE FOR THEIR LIVES.****Lighthizer and Hall Destroy the City in Iowa; A Photo of Devastation.****BY TWENTY-THREE TO NINETEEN.****A DESTRUCTIVE CYCLONE.****Houses Blown Away; Trees Uprooted and Roots Detached.****DENVER, Colo., June 27.—**News has been received of a destructive cyclone which passed over the country yesterday in this and adjoining counties. Many farms have been destroyed, houses torn to shambles and trees uprooted, and the entire country washed away. On the farm of John Miller on Cedar creek a large orange was destroyed. At Taylor's ranch near the city a house was blown away. Houses were blown away, trees uprooted and carried away, and once for many miles completely ruined. A dozen persons were injured, but none killed.**At Clark's ranch fall for twenty minutes and killed about 20 sheep. Mr. J. W.
