The exports of cotton, however, gradually shrunk since 1870, when it amounted in value to \$2,340,000; in 1883 they were only \$2,240,000. Coffee is successfully cultivated, the exports in 1883 amounting to 210,540 pounds in quantity and \$2,285,000 in value. The quality of the coffee is excellent, and great attention is being paid to the cultivation of the plant, a large increase in the exports may be looked for.
