VIEWS CITY'S NEEDS.

Architect Arnold W. Bunner of New York, who has been brought to Salt Lake by the Auerbach estate to look over the situation before planning a new building for the Auerbach proper-ty, has spent the past two days looking over the city's general perspective and

The leases now on the property will expire by fall, when they will be va-cated, and the new building will be connenced.
