His Average Condition During

Eight Weeks.

WASHINGTON, 3.—The average

range by weeks of the President's

pulse and respiration was:

Cabinet Meeting.

A meeting of the cabinet was

called by Secretary Blaine last eve-

ning, and took place this morning at

the State Department. At that

hour all the members arrived and

were shown to the Secretary's room.

Mr. Meacham telegraphed this morn-

ing to the president of the Penn-

sylvania Railroad Company, asking

if a special of six cars could be had

over that road for the use of the

President, and whether arrange-

ments could be made for the safe

and speedy passage to Long Branch.

The reply was received that the

cars could be had at the shortest no-

tice, and the road would be closed

for the passage of the President up

on five hours' notice.

Ought not to remain.

One of the attending surgeons,

this morning, told a friend he be-

lieved the President's symptoms as-

sumed slightly an intermitting

character the past few days. Wed-

nesday was brighter; Thursday less

so; yesterday was a good day, and

his morning he seemed better and

more languid. He thought the

President ought not to remain an

hour longer than necessary, and

would vote for a speedy removal.

The risk of moving is not great. The

full staff of surgeons will consider

the question of removal.
