If a small bag of spice is placed in the kettle when making apple or cranberry jelly the flavor will be much improved, and it varies the jelly without effort. A few leaves of sweet geranium thrown into the jelly also gives a delicious flavor.

It is very important that all green salads, such as lettuce, cabbage, celery, etc., or cress, should be thoroughly cleaned and looked over carefully. In the stems and under the curled-up leaves small bugs are frequently found. Water cress especially should have great care, for in the leaves small snails are hidden.

Children's white dress sleeves can be kept perfectly clean at the table if a small pair of extra sleeves of white are made with an elastic inserted at the top and at the wrist. They can be made of any light-weight material, and are easily laundered. The oversleeves will also be found useful when the children are at play, as the cuffs of a dress soil quickly.

Rice au gratin is a change from plain boiled rice, and is prepared in the same way as macaroni au gratin. Arrange the rice in layers in a baking dish, with white sauce and grated cheese between them. Spread the top with buttered bread crumbs or another layer of cheese, and bake until the top is well browned.

Ashe are not only good for currant worms, but are also good for bugs on cucumbers and squash, or cabbage plants. It should be applied before the dew is off. A good authority states that moth balls placed among young cucumbers and squashes will cause the beetle pests to disappear. This seems a curious remedy, but it is said to be an effective one.
