## LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

**Obsequies.**—The funeral of Elder Hans Jensen, who died on Saturday of dropsy, was held yesterday, at 2 p.m., in the 10th Ward Meeting-house. Elders Isaac Groo, Ness, Blomberg, and Bishop Adam Sjers were the speakers. The services were well attended.

**Personal.**—We were favored with a call, Saturday evening, from Mr. L. V. P. Randall, treasurer of the Illinois Central Railroad, and Mr. Matthias Price, of New York, who are paying us a brief visit while on their way to California. Both are very genial gentlemen.

**The Local Opium Trade.**—Meek-eyed John still continues to indulge in his darling opium. Wells, Fargo's Express delivered \$300 worth of the precious stuff to-day. The package was a seven pound box; it cost \$50 and came from San Francisco. A costly luxury, surely.

**High-toned Runaway.**—Walker Brothers' stallions, attached to a light vehicle, ran away last night. They broke down from some point up town, ran down the State Road, and came part way back upon another street, when they were secured. The buggy was badly broken. No one hurt.

**Water Piping.**—Mr. Joseph A. West, agent for Utah of the New Light Weight Water Pipe, which is now in use in Logan City, and will be in Park City when the water-works there are completed, is in town on business connected with his agency. **Diphtheria.**—Brother J. B. Nash writes from Franklin on the 22nd inst., that the dreadful scourge diphtheria had again broken out in that place. On the day of writing, the two remaining children (both girls) of Brother O. B. Packey, who recently lost his little boy from diphtheria, were laid in one grave, the victims of the same disease. We condole with the bereaved family in their heavy loss.

**Frightful Accident.**—On Saturday afternoon, a frightful accident occurred at Sandy. Thomas Allison was engaged with a crusher at the Mingo Smelter, when his right arm was caught between the rollers and badly smashed. Dr. Benedict amputated the member between the wrist and elbow joint, at the residence of the injured man, soon after the mishap took place. Mr. Allison was an excellent look-alike, and a man of considerable means. He will still render him in his profession, and can render his means of support more precarious.

**In Town.**—Mr. Wm. T. Lewis, of the celebrated wagon and buggy firm of Mitchell, Lewis & Co., Racine, Wis., has been in our city since Friday last on business connected with the house which he represents. In company with Mr. Mattison he made us a pleasant call this morning, and expressed his pleasure at the commercial relations existing between his firm and the people of our Territory. Mr. Lewis is a clever and intelligent gentleman, and we wish him a pleasant visit during his brief sojourn in Utah.

**Shooting and Beating.**—The probable town of Provo, last Tuesday night, was the scene of a disgraceful affray, in which a man named Dr. L. Thompson, a well-known man, was killed.

**Funeral of Sister Thomas.**—The funeral services over the remains of Sister E. F. Thomas were held in the Thirtieth Ward Assembly Rooms, yesterday morning, at 10 o'clock. Previous to the time of commencing the service, the body was conveyed in a vehicle, from the residence of the deceased to the meeting-house, followed by the members of the 18th Ward Relief Society, of which Sister Thomas was first counselor, and other friends and relatives. The building was crowded to its utmost capacity, and many remained outside during the services, unable to procure seats in the interior of the house. The choir sang the hymn, "We have met, dear friends and brethren," after which Elder David O. Calder opened the meeting by prayer. The congregation was then addressed by President Angus M. Cannon and Apostle Joseph F. Smith, in a series of comforting and instructive remarks. The benediction was pronounced by Elder Joseph E. Taylor. Two of the hymns rendered on the occasion were those which were sung by Sister Thomas on her death-bed. The meeting was conducted by Bishop E. D. Woolley. The body was followed by a long concourse of carriages to its last resting place, and the grave was decorated by Apostle Brigham Young.
