Kimball, on the 18th of Nov. 1849; thence removed to Lehi, in 1851, and from there to Beaver in 18C', and died without a struggle or a groan, on the day above named, having been an invalid about 20 years.

Sister Murdcok is extensively and very favorably known. From childhood she was a leading spirit, one of those amiable, sociable and intelligent females who only needed to be known to be respected and beloved. She was very kind and benevolent to the poor and falthful, to her religion, a kind affectionate wife and mother in Israel in very deed.
