Deceased was born in November, 1837 in the town of Fairfax, Kendall County, State of Vermont. His father's name was Clark Colgrove, his mother's name Permillia Ingersoll Colgrove. He was baptized by R. A. McBride. He died as he had lived, a firm believer in the great work as revealed in these latter-days. Just before he died he said, "Welcome, welcome death," and passed away.—Com.

At Parowan, Iron County, Utah, Oct. 27, 1881, of old age, GEORGE HOLYOAK, Sen., aged 82 years, 9 months and 27 days. The deceased embraced the Gospel at Birmingham, England, in June, 1843, emigrated to Utah in 1854, and located in Salt Lake City and from there was called to strengthen Parowan in the same year. The deceased always kept an open house for the Elders who were called to England in the early times, by whom he will be remembered with gratitude. The deceased leaves a very numerous family of children and grandchildren and friends to mourn his loss.—Com.

At Glenwood, Oct. 30, 1881, of typhoid fever, WILLIAM M. PALMER, Jr., son of William M. and Mary Ann Palmer, aged 11 years, 7 months and 11 days.

At Glenwood, Nov. 5, 1881, from injuries received in machine shop, JAMES PERRY, son of J. W. and Sarah E. Jackson, aged 3 years, 2 months and 25 days.

OBITUARY.

We have to mourn the loss of another good man who was one of the first settlers of Utah, namely JOHN ANTHONY WOOLF, who died of pneumonia, at his residence in Hyde Park, Cache County, on Monday, the 7th of November, after a short illness of five days.

Deceased was born in Westchester County, State of New York, on the 31st of July, 1805, and joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in July 1841; moved to Nauvoo, Ills. in 1844, where he purchased a large farm, but had the pleasure of living on it only a short time before being driven from it by a mob. He then went to Council Bluffs where he remained one winter and came to Salt Lake with the first company in 1847. He was called to go to Iron County with the first settlers of that place, from whence he returned to Salt Lake and then removed to Willow Creek, in Juab County, where he opened a farm and made a comfortable home for his large family, but was permitted to enjoy it only a short time before being driven from it by the Indians, when he settled at Nephi, Juab County, where he lived several years, and then moved to Cache Valley, and was among the first to settle Hyde Park.

He was widely known and universally loved and respected, always being a kind friend to the needy; those in want were never turned away empty handed. He was kind and forgiving almost to a fault. Though no seeker after office, he had long been President of one of the quorums of Seventies and was a Justice of the Peace for many years, until death relieved him.

He was the last of three brothers, whose father was one of the Hessians pressed into the British service in the Revolutionary War. His children, grand-children and great-grand-children number over one hundred, who deeply mourn his loss. He died as he had always lived, firm in the faith and a full believer of a glorious world hereafter.

The funeral services were held in Hyde Park; the meeting house which was filled to overflowing, there being but few if any persons in the settlement who were not present. Apostle Moses Thatcher and President Preston, delivered very impressive addresses, which were highly appreciated by all present.—[Com.]

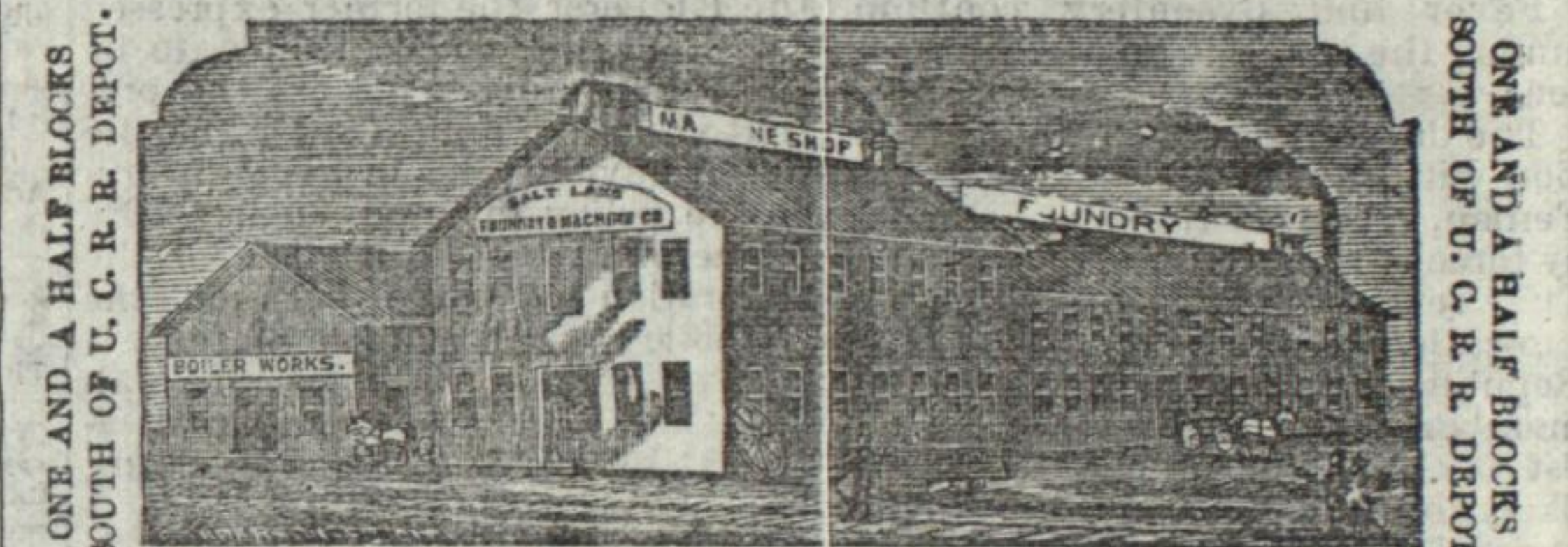
