Indeed the removal of a citizen from office because of his religion, or the refusal to appoint a person to office because of his religion, is practically a violation of an express provision in the Constitution, which reads as follows-

"No religious test shall ever be office or public trust, under the United States." Art. 6, par 3.;

If the Ogden postmaster has been removed on account of his religion, he has been removed for unconstitutional reasons, and so far as his case is concerned the above constitutional provision has been practically ignored.
