St. Louis, 6.—Thirty-six of the fifty-five precincts of this county give Greeley 5,800 mostly. Only two wards in the city vote for Greeley, and the result on the State and county tickets is not known yet, as the returns have not been counted, but it is believed they will fall far short of anything behind the times. Greeley has no doubt, but we doubt that the Democrats have elected the three Congressmen in this county.

Calno, Ill., 6.—Calno gives a Republican majority of 100, and the vote for Congress, 97; Oglesby, 60; governor, 72. The Republican gain is nearly 600 over the vote of 1888. The Republicans claim the election of Clement, Congress man, in the 16th district by over 1,000 majority. The Democrats concede it by 800.
