LOCAL BRIEFS.

Will Offer Blue Ribbons—The Manufacturers and Merchants' association will offer 25 blue ribbons as special premiums for industrial exhibits at the next state fair.

Stock in Berlin—A cablegram received from the north of a daughter to Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Best of this city, who are studying music at the German capital.

Deserter Arrested—Officer Tom Gillette yesterday arrested Harold Babler, aged 35, charged with desertion. It is claimed Babler deserted the United States army in California three years ago.

Liberty Ward—The saints of Liberty ward will be addressed Sunday evening, March 15, by Historian Andrew Jensen; meeting held at the store building on Third East, between Ninth and Tenth South, at 6:30 p. m. All are invited.

Enjoyable Choir Dance—The annual dance of the tabernacle choir was given last evening in the Odeon, prefaced by a musical program, and followed by several old time square dances. Horace Ensign was master of ceremonies.

Many People in the East—There will be 160 people in the east of the Elks' dramatic performance to be given in the Salt Lake Theater, tonight, in aid of the Elks' orphanage. The play, "The Elks' Booster," the annual publication of the order will appear on the 19th inst.

Entertainment Postponed—The entertainment that was to have been given in the Salt Lake Theater, tonight, in aid of the Elks' orphanage, has been postponed until the 25th inst., on account of the Wilton Lackaye engagement, which continues through the 21st.

To Observe Anniversary—The sixtieth anniversary of the organization of the Relief society of the Church will be held on the 17th inst., and in honor of the event, several of the wards will give a social and reunion, with an interesting program and refreshments.

Forest Ranger Examined—There will be a civil service examination for forest ranger, April 23, next, in the Federal building. The age limit is 21 to 45 years, and the candidates are expected to be well posted in the duties to be rendered of them, particularly in practical forestry.

Vagrant Dog Nuisance—There is more complaint than ever about vagrant dogs in town. They are becoming a grievous nuisance, tearing up the lawns and getting into the catch of the spring gun, and otherwise making trouble. There is a loud call for the dog catcher.

New Addition Planned—The Freedmen Office Supply company is to have a new addition to its present quarters, to consist of two stories and a basement. A new elevator is to be installed, and a blue print department established. This improvement will give the building a depth of 165 feet, and a width of 25 feet. The color scheme will be turned oak and granite and the office fixtures similar to those of a bank.
