The northwestern low pressure area still remains central over Br tish Co-lumbia, and has caused rain during the past 24 hours over Oregon and Washing-ton. High barometric pressure prevails over the remainder of the country, ex-cept over the middle and north Atlantic and New England states, where low pressure, attended by general rains, still countines.

From the existing pressure conditions, local rain may be expected in this lo-cality tonight or Saturday; cooler to-inght.
