DEATH OF GEO. DRYBURGH.

Well known resident of Sandy a victim of Spinal Meningitis.

George Dryburgh, a well known resident of Sandy, died at his home there last night of spinal meningitis, after an illness of two weeks. The deceased was in his sixtieth year, having been born in Fifehire, Scotland, Dec. 4, 1843, from which section he emigrated to Utah in 1878. In politics he was an ardent Democrat and figured prominently in local conventions for a number of years. He leaves a wife, two sons and four daughters to mourn his loss.

The funeral will be held from the late residence in Sandy tomorrow, Thursday, at 10 a. m. Interment will be in the South Cottonwood cemetery.

Weekly Crop Bulletin.

Temperatures Were High, but Rains Were of Great Benefit.

Section Director Hyatt of the local weather office has issued the following crop bulletin for the week ending today:

Temperatures during the week were generally considerably above normal. Local thunderstorms were quite common throughout the section on the 15th and 16th, excepting over the northern tier of counties where no precipitation whatever occurred. These storms retarded the maturing of crops and the accompanying high winds caused some slight damage by scattering hay and grain in the stack. These drawbacks were more than compensated for by the great benefits derived from the rain.

SECTION HAND RUNS AMUCK.

Robs a Fellow Laborer, Has a Fight And Takes to the Hills.

Peter Kodnes, a Greek section hand on the Oregon Short Line, robbed a fellow laborer of \$100 yesterday afternoon, engaged in a rough and tumble fight with his victim, cutting him severely in the face, and then took to the foothills near Beck's Hot Springs and, with a rifle, endeavored to make his escape. The section gang has been camping at the springs for several days. Yesterday one of the men placed \$100 of his money in his bunk in the car. In the afternoon he missed the money and accused Kodnes of taking it.

A fight ensued between the two men, and it was dark by the time they had killed each other. Several other Greeks came to the rescue of the victim, and Kodnes ran to the car, secured a rifle and made for the foothills nearby. He took up his position behind some rocks about half-way up the mountain and defied his pursuers. The men, not being armed, were unable to capture Kodnes, so a number of them stood watch while others went to the line quarry and telegraph for help from the sheriff's office. Deputies Sharp and Butler were sent to the scene in a rig as quickly as possible, but it was dark by the time they arrived, and the Greek had made his escape over the hills, keeping his life trained on his watchers while making his escape. The deputies searched the hills until midnight, but could not find the Greek.

TROUBLE OVER CATTLE.

Mrs. Borg and Sons Interfere and Are Placed Under Arrest.

Mrs. Annie Borg and her two sons, Frank and James, were arrested last yesterday afternoon by Deputy Sheriff Sharp, Poth and Butler on the charge of interfering with an officer. Deputy Sheriff Sharp went down to Mrs. Borg's ranch to levy on 20 head of cattle to satisfy a judgment secured against Mrs. Borg by a man named Anderson. He secured the cattle and had driven the bunch almost to the church farm when Mrs. Borg and her sons overtook him and demanded the cattle. The deputy refused the demand and the boys, by some quick maneuvering, turned the bunch on the run for home.

Deputy Sharp was left in the rear, but not in the least disturbed by the incident. He at once telephoned for reinforcements and, upon the arrival of the other two officers, they proceeded to the dairy and placed the entire family under arrest and recovered the cattle.

Mrs. Borg and sons were taken before Judge Poth and were placed under arrest of \$100 each, which they furnished and were released.
