HU NEWELL, Ks., 12.—The Oklahoma settlers broke camp, on Bitton Creek, at 10 this morning, and came here along the State line, closely followed by the federal cavalry under Col. Coppinger. The federalists are also camped here, but in the Indian Territory. A conference between General Faine and Major Maldon on the one side, and Col. Coppinger and Lieutenant Mason on the other, occurred this morning but was fruitless. The United States troops were told that colonialists would enter the territory of Oklahoma at any hazard, unless prohibited by Congress. Recruits are constantly pouring in and many are deserting also. It is estimated that 2,500 are already across. Many of the recruits are from the drouthy regions of Kansas, where farming is a failure and there is a lack of bread. Services will be held here to-morrow. Situation critical.
