

## SOUTHERN BEAUTY SECRETS

How the Langhorne Sisters Retain Their Looks—Outdoor Exercise Helps

THERE are not many women who enjoy notoriety. And among those who do not like it at all can be numbered the Langhorne sisters, the famous beauties of Virginia. Numbered among the F. F. V., and standing high in the aristocracy of the south, they preferred to keep in the background, but their beauty was such that they could not be kept down, and, from one step to another, they have traveled on, growing more beautiful and more famous.

And both Mrs. Perkins and Mrs. Egmont Brooks are great beauties, while the unmarried sister is charming. But the glory of "Mrs. Nannie," as they call her in London, is the most delightful of all.

A short time ago one of the neighbors of the Langhorne family revealed many beauty secrets which may be regarded as the beauty secrets of the Langhorne family. "The Langhorne girls are clever," said this lady, "without really intending to be so. They have made themselves into great beauties almost unconsciously. In fact, they have fought shy of suitors. Yet they have succeeded in landing the best matrimonial fish that have been caught. They do it by the 'Langhorne' rule, and in ways purely 'Langhorne'—without realizing that they are doing anything out of the ordinary.

"They are most particular about their looks," said the neighbor. "Not for the world would they attire themselves carelessly. I never have seen them other than faultlessly dressed. Mrs. Gibson, as a girl, was what might be called

the pink of prettiness. Her clothes looked as though they had just been laundered, and not as much as a handkerchief was ever crumpled. She had a way of looking as sweet as a pink.

They will be cut down the middle, the seeds will be taken out, and you will be served with some orange juice for your face. It is supposed to take off freckles and yellow spots and make your skin pink and pretty.

"The Langhorne sisters have the most marvelous figures. And this is almost wholly due to the life they lead. I don't believe any one of the sisters ever stored in the house half a day, consecutively, in her life. From early in the morning until dusk the girls are out. Their specialty is horseback riding. The result is that they all have wonderful figures. Mrs. Gibson, at the time of her marriage, had a waist as slender as that of a girl of 15, while her figure, unfortunately, was a good 28. She was the widest chested girl in the south. It was a treat to see her walk.

## HENRY WOLFSON DISCUSSES FOREIGN ARTISTS.

ONCE in a long while, say between seasons or at the end of a prosperous one, the manager of singers and virtuosi—the impresario, as we used to call him—will talk of his work, his "artists" and his public, says Musical America. Henry Wolfson, one of the ablest and busiest managers of the pianists, the violinists and the concert singers who come to us from Europe or that make their way in their own country, did speak of these things the other day in New York.

"I have been asked many times," he said for example, "if I had any difficulty in getting these world-famous artists to come to America, and I have to laugh whenever I answer. In the experience of a quarter of a century there are only two names that occur to me as belonging to celebrities who even hesitated. Both of these were afraid of the long ocean voyage. One was Joachim and the other Hans Richter. Distances in Europe are short; an artist can travel from one city to another and fulfill his engagements without loss of sleep and without becoming irritated by the thousand and one little things that rattle the nerves here. Considering what they have to endure, even now, and what they are to put up with here 20 years or so ago, it is a marvel that the American dollar has proved so potent.

"Rubinstein was one of the first European celebrities that ever came to this country in my day. Naturally when he returned he was asked that ever original question as to how he had enjoyed his tour, and he replied that the best thing about it was the knowledge that he had made so much money that he would never have to come back. He lived up to the privilege gained. There is no doubt that the pioneers, like Rubinstein, looked on coming to America as a pilgrimage.
