JUDICIAL COGNIZANCE.

GENTLEMEN OF THE GRAND **JURY:** The Supreme Court of California has said: "Courts are bound to take notice of the political and social condition of the country which they judicially rule." it thoroughly; and if I can but once establish it, the laws will soon appear to flow from thence as from their source.

ABSOLUTE VETO.
