Planchette is a simple looking instrument about ten inches long and seven or eight inches broad in the broadest part. It is a small three-legged, heart-shaped board, the sorface of which is highly polished. Under each lobe of the heart is a short leg, which turns on a pivot at the top, and to the bottom of which a small wheel is attached. Unwhich a small wheel is attached. Un-der the point of the heart the pencil is fixed in a similar manner to the legs, so that the machine will turn in any di-rection with the greatest facility. The operators sit with their hands resting lightly on Planchette, their thumbs and little fingers touching and forming a circle around it.
