Its next semi-annual dividend will probably be \$2 per share, or at the rate of \$1,200,000 annually. The total amount paid in on Utah stock for pur-chase of property, development, smel-ter construction and profit of promot-ers was only \$1,500,000. More than \$3,-000,000 has already been paid in divi-dends to stockholders, or twice the original investment. It is estimated that 20,000 shares of Utah have been purchased for inside interests between \$25 and \$45 per share. There is believed to be nearly the equiv-alent of this price per share in sight in the mine, and the deepest openings are declared to be the richest ore so far opened.
