"And now as to the general purpose of this address. The idea which I wish first to impress is that there is in the American heart a deep undercurrent of disgust at the form in which society is organized; second, that the uprising of the people in avor of the reorganization of society in the Owen and Fourier excitement was far mightier and more widespread than most people imagine; third, that the success attained was sufficient to encourage further efforts in this direction; and fourth, that there has been and can be no permanent success of integral socialism except where the movement is based upon strong religious convictions." He had no new discoveries in the history of socialism to present, and wished to dwell mainly upon the lessons to be derived from it. He would make some use of Noyes' lessons to be derived from it. He would make some use of Noyes' book, which was mainly compiled from the manuscripts of McDonald, who spent from 1842 to 1854 in visiting the wrecks of socialistic experiments in this country. The other principal sources of Noyes' information were the Fourierite newspapers.
