Yellow Fever. PENNSYLVANIA, 19.—The outlook is worse than since the first yellow fever case was reported.

AGRICULTURE, Maine, 19.—Official returns from all of the State except five small plantations give a total vote of 138,176; Robie 72,544; Plisted 33,753; Chase 1,395; Vinton 2,232; and 19,152 for the remainder.

Little Rock, Ark., 19.—Official returns from the State election show the following vote for governor: Berry, democrat, 85,675; Black, republican, 44,352; Garland, greenbacker, 10,142; total vote 140,169.

FOREIGN.

Restoring Order in Egypt.

ALEXANDRIA, 19.—The regiment which left Aboukir last night to attack the British at Damietta, was Arabi Pasha's own and numbered 5000 men.

Constantinople, 19.—The Porte has tendered his submission. Zagazig, 10.—The entire population in this part of the country have returned to their homes and they are working in the fields.

Dublin, 19.—At Sevinford, County Mayo, the death of a man named Green was posted at the court house at the suit of Lord Dillon.

St. Petersburg, 19.—The czar starts for Moscow to-night, most probably for coronation. All private telegraphic and railway traffic in the direction of Moscow will be suspended until his arrival there.

Halifax, 19.—A telegram to-night to the naval authorities states that the British war ship Florida, which was on the coast of Prince Edward's Island, had been bilged and filled with water.

The Mexican National Railway is accepted by the engineers for the Mexico Government.

The damage by floods in Italy and Austria amount to 2,000,000 florins.

The Massachusetts democratic State convention nominated Ben Butler for governor, yesterday.

At Chicago, yesterday, Sarah Estlin built a fire and deliberately took over it until it was fatally burned.

At Manila in the Philippine Islands there were 102 deaths from cholera Friday and Saturday, and 306 in the vicinity.

The police of Montreal, Canada, have been notified from London to look out for a Russian who stole \$75,000 worth of bonds in that city.

The Pennsylvania Railroad Company yesterday voluntarily paid \$30,000 in aid of the municipal government of Jersey City for 1882.

The value of domestic bread stuffs exported in the first months ended August 19, was \$10,015,705 against \$17,505,235 for the same time in 1881.

The issue of standard dollars from the various mints during the past week was \$375,000, while for the corresponding week last year the issue was \$434,000.

At Providence, Rhode Island, yesterday the assistant yardmaster and switchman of the Providence & Worcester Railroad was arrested for robbing freight cars.

Major Phipps, the defaulting superintendent of the Philadelphia almshouse, was arrested at Hamilton, Ont. He was known there as J. H. Thompson.

Rev. A. G. Troy of Montreal, Canada, has floated the Colonization Society for the Northwest territory, on the London market with a nominal capital of \$1,000,000.

During the first half of the present year, the receipts of the Russian government have increased 19,500,000 roubles, but the expenditures have increased 23,000,000.

At a meeting of the members of the Cotton Exchange at Memphis, Tennessee, yesterday afternoon, a committee was appointed to solicit aid for the yellow fever sufferers at Pensacola, and \$1,100 were collected.

General Manager Williams states that the nickel plate road will be open for business October 16th. The road is in direct competition with the Lake Shore and is creating a good deal of scare among the Lake Shore management.

At San Francisco, Deputy United States Marshal Sloumerville was killed in a fight with the Manning brothers. The trouble has been brewing for months and Sloumerville sought every opportunity to provoke a quarrel.
