The Crisis Passed.  
WASHINGTON, 19. - Executive Mansion, July 19, 7 p. m. The President has passed an excellent day and this afternoon's fever has been less than on any day since he was wounded. At 1 p. m. his pulse was 98, temperature 98.5, respiration 19. At present his present pulse is 95, temperature 98.8, respiration 19.

July 19, 1881, 7 p. m.  
The slightly increased feverish rise which occurred yesterday evening, but which was not due to any unfavorable change in the condition of the President, has entirely disappeared and at this hour the President's pulse is 90, with normal temperature and respiration. He rested well during the night, and a half hour without awakening, and is now feeling bright and comfortable. There will be a slight change in the diet, something else being substituted for potatoes and oatmeal, which have been found unsatisfactory.

The President passed a very good night, and this morning he is free from fever, and expresses a comfortable feeling, pulse 90, temperature 98.5, respiration 19.
