Brother Brough was a man of sterling integrity, upright in his dealings with his fellow - man, honest in his purpose, unwavering faith. zealous for the cause he had espoused, faithfully performing the duties of his office, according to the wisdom and ability he possessed, ever striving to keep within counsel. Was a faithful husband and a kind father. He called all of his family together, with the exthem one by one, like unto Jacob of old, charging them to be honest and virtuous, seeking the things of righteousness, and not to set their hearts too much on the things of this world, and when asked a day or two previous to his death if they should send for William, his answer was no; he is doing a good work, let him stay at his post until he is honorably released. He remarked, we fear death, but Oh, how sweet. I am going with the armor of righteousness on, and will soon take up my labors again; gave instructions as to the funeral services and burlal, and retained his reasoning faculties until he fell asleep to await the resurrection of the just.
