

**COFFROTH READY
TO OFFER \$50,000**

Teeling of Jeffries, Johnson, Promoter and Managers Scheduled for Tuesday Night—Jeff in Training.

New York, Oct. 25.—With the expected rivalry here today of James Crofuth, the man, promoter, fight promoter, the coming contest between James J. Jeffries and Jack Johnson for the heavyweight championship of the world has assumed the character of a contest of sporting men. A full license for the fight or offer of a challenge to Crofuth, is authority for the statement that the promoter is prepared to hold \$50,000 for the fight or offer 75 per cent of the gross receipts. There seems to be little doubt now that the information is correct and right.

Jeffries is vigorously pursuing his training. Each day he takes long walks, usually with one or two friends, and after lunch he punches the bag and does callisthenic exercises on the roof of the hotel where he is registered. The popular aviator to see Sam Jeffries was not then rewarded by success, as the former champion takes his meals in his rooms, but it is said that he is doing as though he expected to enter the ring on a few hours' notice.

The meeting has been arranged for Jeffries' first home fight, with George Crofuth and Johnson for Tuesday night, and if Johnson and his manager, George S. Stein, do not arrive here in time, a conference will be held Wednesday night, and it is expected that this meeting will settle the date and the details of articles and the posting of forfeits.
