From Different Points of View.****Salt Lake, April 19.—Anna Dickinson, who has been confined to a room at the Hotel Atlantic, will undergo medical treatment.****OFFICIALLY DENIED.****PHILADELPHIA, April 19.—Theory that Anna Dickinson was a woman when she was committed to the Paupers' Insane Asylum, and that her case was not officially referred to the state insane law officers in her case, flatly violated, and that Philadelphia physicians and officials were completely ignorant of the facts of her case, officially and particularly denied here.****The letter which Miss Dickinson says she sent to the chairman and secretary of the Mental Hygiene Committee of the Missouri State Board of Health, Dr. W. H. Schatz, and Dr. W. E. Howell, was received by Dr. Wetherell, who visited her immediately, in company with the attorney of the board, Mr. Isaac L. Wolfson.****Mr. Wolfson said: "We found****Miss Dickinson installed in the most comfortable ward of the whole institution. The interview was necessarily brief, as we had no time to speak to us, or at least would say little.****When we actually talked to her, she walked steadily up and down, the room giving utterance to her thoughts.****At the time of her confinement, the number insane persons are****now known to be 1,000.****NEW YORK, April 19.—"Why have you been so long silent?
