WASHINGTON, Jan. 4.—A hearing of the ways and means committee today Wm. Bright, of Newark, N. J., representing the flax-growers of that section, and the Knights of Labor, asked that the duty on dressed flax be increased from \$40 to \$50 per ton. He said the flax in this country is largely imported because of insufficient protection. The cost of dressing a ton of flax in this country is \$15, while in Europe it is but \$5. He asked the additional duty upon the difference in wages above.

A grain dealer, a twice spinner, asked that the present duties be retained on jute, flax and manilla. He asserted that under the conditions that obtained formerly, and which could be reproduced with adequate encouragement, the existence of a legitimate trade would have been impossible.

Treasurer Halibut, of the Chamber of Commerce, asked more than twice as much as in Scotland, and from five to ten times as much as in the United States. He argued in favor of free trade.

Charles E. Pearce, of St. Louis, made a comparison of the cost of flax in the United States and in Europe. He showed that with jute free, a duty of at least 2 cents per yard up on the manufactured product must be laid in order to maintain the industry in this country, and if the present duty of \$5 per ton is retained, the duty on the manufactured product must be at least 2 cents per yard. REMARKS MEANS BUSINESS.
He Contemplates a Radical Change of Base in His Policy.
BERLIN, Jan. 4.—A state council is convened for Wednesday next. Bismarck, though still ill from a recent attack of pneumonia, is certain to be present. The council will be held for the last several days before dissolution, and the reopening of the legislative session. The leading questions before the Reichstag will be increased credits and the social bill. Bismarck's long expected declaration on the foreign policy will probably be made during the debate on the military credits. The attitude of the government on the socialist bill is inflexible.

THE YEAR OPENS WITH A UNIVERSAL POPE.
The National Zeitung declaring external tranquility is guaranteed, while internal tranquility depends entirely on the character of the next Reichstag.

YET, despite this lovely prospect, abroad and at home upon itself, the Reichstag is not pervaded by a sense of security and of the continuance of the triple alliance. Bismarck's refusal to support Austria's policy in Bulgaria is a great source of irritation and suspicion, and Crisp's persistent intrigues for the coalition of Trentino is another.
