If any man should come be fore you against whom you may hav any feeling, you must lay it all aside and look at it unpartially, in the ligh tonal standpoint. Your sole purpose must be to ascertain the truth of the accusation against him. Your oath

require further that you shall not leave any person unindicted through fear, favor, affection, or for any re-ward, or hope of any. You are re-quired to act from pure motives; you cannot act from personal considera-tions; you cannot take into consideralon any consequences to you, any consequences to any man. The law describes the conduct that consti-tutes crime and it is for you to determine in every case whether the person has been guilty of that conduct with the intentions which the law re-quires in order to make a crime. I feel t my duty further to remark, that you are not to take into consideration any public clamor for or against any man or against any class of crime. There appears to be an impression, judging from the public prints and common re-port, that associations, bodies of men and women, can by withdrawing their patronage and their support from businessmen, induce them to disapprove of the enforcement of the laws of their country. This you cannot take into consideration. The fact that any man, because he may be affected in his business, may disap-prove of the catorcement of the laws
