Senior Teller and Associates State
THEIR VOW.

THE REASONS WHY THEY HOLTZ.

Ind 4. Declaration that they will
support the Silverite cause.

DENVER, Colo., July 20.—Senators Teller and six of his associates will tell the national Republicans tonight, this evening, at a meeting in the Hotel Colorado, in the street Republicans of the country, setting forth their view of the situation. The most important resolution and statement have been in conference at Denver for several days over their differences. In addition to those regarding the census, Senator Pennington of South Dakota and Senator Cannon of Utah are declared to be in sympathy with, although Senator Cannon was not present at the conference, owing to business engagements in Boston.

THE ADDRESS.

The address is as follows:

We meet at this time, with our brethren affiliated with the national Republican party, and we have rejected the Diamond plan of the platform adopted at Denver, and decided to support the national convention, should state our position in the presidential campaign, and give briefly our reasons in support thereof.

When certain delegates to the national Republican convention rejected the Diamond plan of the platform and withdrew from the convention, we determined that we would give our support to such candidates as could support most willingly expansion of the silver standard, and give freely their right place to a standard money.

The Democratic party in its Chicago convention has taken a position in its platform as pronounced favorable to silver and has nominated candidates in order to give weight to its position. We expect soon candidates to come forward who will support the silver standard, and give freely their right place to a standard money.

We therefore announce that we shall not vote for the Diamond plan of the platform, and, therefore, we do not support the national convention, and withdraw from the convention, should state our position in the presidential campaign, and give freely their right place to a standard money.

The Democrats who believe in the gold standard are unswerving in their opposition to support McKinley or supporting him in the election of Mr. McKinley's enemies. A great number of leading and influential Democratic journals have declared they will support the Republican nominees. It is evident there is to be a union of forces of all who are in favor of the gold standard, and who desire to support the policy of the national convention.

Those who believe in a standard which means the equal treatment of both gold and silver at the ports of the nation, that is, to put one rate to all ports, and to the exclusion of the ports of the world, are in the minority. The policy which we believe is fraught with danger to the nation and to the people.

Gold manipulation means the shifting of gold about as quickly as possible, and the burden of commerce must forever borne by gold and silver, and as the world's stock of these metals has always been kept equal in amount, it means the draining of the wealth upon gold. Draining the burden upon gold means waste
