Resolved, That the city provide a sufficient number of teams and suitable wagons and carts to do the work of removing all garbage, night soil and dead animals and substances detrimental to good sanitary conditions by order of the health commissioner, to be paid for from the general appropriation; provided, however, that no team or horse shall be used for the removal of garbage, night soil or dead animals, when done by the city force, shall be paid for by the owners of property at a price as per a schedule hereafter to be fixed by the Council.
