

PEACE PROTOCOL SIGNED.

Document That Closes Actual Warfare Receives the Signatures of Government Representatives.

Military Commission Meets Within Thirty Days to Arrange for Spanish Evacuation of Cuba and Porto Rico—Manila to Surrender—Peace Commission Meets in Paris October 1.

Washington, Aug. 12.—The peace protocol was signed at 11:30 p. m. The protocol provides: 1.—That Spain will relinquish all claims of sovereignty over and title to Cuba. 2.—That Porto Rico and other Spanish islands in the West Indies and all islands in the Eastern Sea, shall be ceded to the United States...
