## FOREIGN.

### GREAT BRITAIN.

#### Foreign News.

**London.**—Following the riot at Dangannon on Sunday, many police were wounded. Their ranks were several times broken. They finally fired buckshot into the crowd. The firing was returned from revolvers and shotguns of the rioters. Many persons were almost killed on the points of the bayonets in the eagerness of attack. The police then fired a volley of ball cartridges and many persons were wounded. One man had his head riddled with buckshot, and received a bullet in the abdomen, from which he died shortly after.

At Downpatrick, in the fight between the Catholics and Orange-

men, firearms were used incessantly from 11 p.m. on Sunday till 3 a.m. on Monday. Several persons were wounded and killed.

The Right Honorable E. W. Foster, chief secretary for Ireland, while driving with the Duke of Angiano yesterday, received a telegram arranged by his colleagues, called this morning by a mail steamer for Dublin. The information contained in the dispatches was so serious that he immediately arranged to leave for London personally the state affairs to the Cabinet.

Fluero-pneumonia has made its appearance in 17 farms in Duncanshire.

A new Atlantic cable company has been registered with the Portuguese Co., for a cable to England via the Azores and thence to England.

A. J. A. has been reported as being considered of having a light cable by this route.

Sir Charles Dilke, under foreign Secretary, is suffering from rheumatism, and his condition now is considered serious.

The enemy's force in the attack on the position at Kuch on Sunday night was estimated at 2,000. The loss was 200 killed instead of sixty as reported.

The British loss was fifteen killed and

Twenty-five wounded. The large brigade of Gen. Stewart's force has reached London. The British are now pointing to the probability of a Fenian plot to blow up the barracks, guards have been doubled and patrols of eighty men watch the exterior of the barracks night and day. Two hundred barrels of gun powder were found on Monday in the railway tunnel under the barracks.

Casualties: 150. Ayoub Kahn, a second lieutenant, killed, but little damage is being done.

The Sultan, at the audience he gave Mr. Goshen, British ambassador, asked him how it was possible to expect him to give up the only overland communication to the British from Bulgaria, and expressed fear that Greece would act in a similar manner towards them. Mr. Goshen assured the Sultan that this was impossible and that he would tell that England and other Powers would guarantee good treatment to the Muslims.

Hafuz Pasha, Minister of Police, has been dismissed on account of his political views. He has been replaced by Hadi Hafiz.

Ex-President Lerdo is expected to return to Mexico from new post of minister to the United States. The Lerdoists and those in power are said to favor the triumph of Gonzalez. The op-

**DELETED GEORGE, Aug. 12, 1890**  
Editor's Dearest News,

August 4th, at 6 p.m. President

and Mr. J. G. Blesk, R. Beasly and your humble servant started route for Mt. Trumbull. At about 10 p.m. we camped at Fort Pease near the town of St. George. The next day, traveled over the trail to the top of Hurricane Hills where we camped for the night, and arrived at the Nixon Mill, Mt. Trumbull next day (Friday) at 12 m.

The next morning, Mr. J. G. Blesk and you and myself started for the "Pine Pole," situated on highest peak of Trumbull, placed there in 1874 by Capt. Wheeler's exploring party. It was called "Gable Point No. 9."

We tried to go without sundogs and had a fine view of the country from the observatory and saw many ever beheld. A distance of some miles we saw the Pine V. Mountains, towering toward us like a city, and so the snow could be seen.

From here we saw San Francisco Mountains, Arizona, and the peaks of the Colorado, and as far westward reach, in every direction, were fearful gorges, precipitous

river table lands, rocks of every conceivable shape and color. The Grand Canyon of the Colorado is the heart, the entire country a beating heart, the entire state a pulse. The Colorado washes their base. While passing upon this romantic pile of rocks and flat-topped mountains one almost wonders how the water could get up there to be broken up until your eyes strike the numerous extinct volcanoes, and the large lava beds which indicate a time when the earth did tremble, and the mountains were first born, and the waters belched forth their fires and streams of lava.

We reached the mill some time after dark, tired but pleased with our trip.

August 17, President McAllister, Bishop Cannon, Elders J. W. Nixon, R. Beasley and myself, on our horseback trip to the timber tract, visited Blake's view, about four miles distant. Our outfit of saddles was amusing. The worthy mayor of St. George rode on a pictureque, mounted on a fiery gray pony, with a saddle lacking the stirrups. J. W. Nixon, bestriding a peak-saddle, and as for the rest of the party, we rode on the rest of the party as we glide through the timber belching the fresh morning

On our way we passed by the old mill sites where all the lumber for settling was made. Then after visiting Blake's mill we rode on to "Point Lookout" where we had a fine view of the country, the same as can be had from the top of Truckee. The thought was so extensive. On our return we passed a group of very degraded Indians who were preparing their dinner of "Yant." Some of the brethren got a piece to taste, and it was very good, sweet, rich food; I have nothing to say about its cleanliness. After riding about 15 miles we arrived at our temporary home again, where we did justice to a good dinner prepared for us by the Sisters Nolin.

On Sunday, the 8th, held meeting, all the brethren addressed the Saints, a branch was organized with J. W. Nolin as President, Elder and J. W. Nolin Supt. of Sunday School with John McConnell as assistant and secretary. All present enjoyed the meeting.

On Monday we traveled 50 miles to Rock Canyon, where we camped for the night, and arrived home at 12 m. next day, all well, having had a pleasant trip.
