Wired from Washington.

WASHINGTON, 21.—The Presi-

dent will probably leave Wash-
ington tomorrow afternoon for New
York, to witness the opening of the
New York Bridge, which will be
opened by Folger, Channing, and
Gresham and Brewster.

Ingersoll expects to occupy two or
three days of the present week be-
fore concluding. He said to an As-
sociated Press reporter to-night that
his argument would be the last
made by the defense. Merrick
would follow him to the prosecution
and give his opinion.

Ingersoll resumed his argument
in the same route as to-day, and
had little time to speak on the char-
acter of Moore's testimony.
