Blaine sent the following to Lowell at half-past ten:

Long Branch, 10.30 p.m.,11.

The President had an increase of fever last night, and was very rest-less until five a.m. During the day he has been somewhat better, but his pulse, temperature and res-piration have been higher for the entire 24 hours than on any preced-ing day since he reached Long Branch. His other symptoms are not re-assuring, and his general con-dition gives rise to anxiety.
