

MAY DAY MOVES HIGHER TODAY.

Probable Settlement with Yankee Con. Gives Better Tone to Stock.

DALY-WEST STILL CLIMBS.

WILL DEVELOP CACTUS GROUP.

The Royal Copper Company Organized for That Purpose.

YANKEE CON. MAY SETTLE.

Sales Made Today at \$22.30—Star Con. and Sacramento are Firmer—Yankee Sells at Better Figures.

Trading on the mining exchange this morning was restricted to 6,650 shares, which changed hands for \$5,209.42. May Day was quite strong today owing, probably, to news that the Yankee Con. was considering making a settlement for the trespass. The stock opened at \$5 and after selling up to 35¢ it weakened to 35¢ at the close. Some 2,600 shares changed hands during the call.

Daly-West was very active again today at \$22.30 per share. At this price 150 shares changed hands. Star Con. was also much improved, though the trading was confined to 200 shares, which changed hands at 60¢ and 67¢.

Sacramento was firmer today, a lot of 1,699 shares changing hands at 34¢. Eagle and Blue Bell was released on a bid of 83¢ in spite of the fact that a 3-car shipment of ore is on the market. Lower Mammoth opened at 40¢, but weakened to 38¢ with the sale of 500 shares.

Yankee Con. dropped 1,500 shares at 9¢ while Golden Eagle was let down to 8¢. Bullion-Beck was an offering at \$4.94. Mammoth was weaker with \$2.13 bid. South Swanson was offered at \$1.12, with only \$1.00 bid. Petro continues very weak.

USHERS AND MESSENGERS.



Manager C. E. Allen of the Centennial-Eureka reports work going along very satisfactorily in the lower levels of that mine. The zinc from the 800' is now down 75 feet. It was thought best to follow the course of the ore by zinc. This enables the management to know just where to run the 900' or 1,000' levels and saves "groping in the dark" and thereby incurring unnecessary expense. This zinc from the 800' level has been sent all the way down to its present depth. Nothing is said about the value of the ore. In regard to the reported big strike, however, Mr. Allen said, "It is not necessary to contradict what is not true."
