THE GRAND JURY

Is held to investigate the manipulations of Ogden's City Council.

Of late there seems to be considerable uneasiness manifested by certain members of our city council. It is said that some pretty strong evidence was brought out in the investigation.

The Brown Will.

Some time since the will of the late John Brown was filed with Clerk Lastwidge of the probate court, and July 27—yesterday—was the date for hearing the petition of the executors. In the question it has been discovered that Mr. Brown did not sign the will in the presence of the witnesses, Oscar Hill, Thomas Williams and H. W. Cruse, therefore it is not known whether the instrument is valid or not. It is submitted to probate. When the will was signed by Messrs. Hill and Williams, the place where the signature of Mr. Brown now appears was blank, and while there is no doubt as to the genuineness of the signature, there is also no proof of the non-signing of either witness.

As a result serious complications may ensue. The estate, which includes the Brown hotel and other real property in this city is valued from \$100,000 to \$120,000.
