RETURNS FROM THE COLUMBUS CON. MINE

Manager Tony Jacobson Brings Along Fine Sample of Ore From New Discovery Above 400 Level.

Manager Tony Jacobson, of the Columbus Con., came down from Cottonwood last night after spending a couple of days at the mine, the condition of which is said to be improving right along.

In addition to this discovery the face of the drift on the 400 level is reported to be looking exceptionally good just now. From a small streak of ore a week or two ago, the ore body in this drift has widened to a full face of shipping ore.

The mine is not shipping the tonnage it could if the means of transportation were better, but some shipments are being made and the mine is being shaped up for a heavy production later on.
