Continue the Spraying.

Because of the general circulation of your paper in Weber county, I beg to say in a few words to our fruit growers on the subject of spraying.

First I desire to compliment Weber county citizens for the very efficient cooperation with the government in the particular law. I consider the action that our county in Utah has had less trouble arising from entomology of the law than in Weber county. While it is true that some persons have sprayed in a careless manner merely to comply with the law, still the large majority of Weber county fruit growers have conscientiously tried to make the spraying effective.

Just as some men pay in a negligent manner without the true spirit of self-interest, so have some sprayed without heart in the work. But that is not the case with the majority of the county. Every farmer who has sprayed, either in the summer or in the winter, has done so in the manner of spraying, as with any other undertaking the result is proportionate to the thought and care expended.

Therefore I look on most gratifying results in this county for the first year's operation of the new law. However, I wish to urge a continuation of the work. Starting the work in the summer, and continuing it in the winter, is the best way to keep the fruit trees free from the pest. It is not enough to spray once in the summer, and then stop. The work must be continued in the winter, and the fruit trees must be kept free from the pest.

Another reason for this July spraying is the very serious reason we are having. The excessive wetness and cold spells have caused great irregularity in the budding of all the injurious insects. Not only the codling moth, but the apple tree borer, the apple sawfly, the apple maggot, and the apple worm, are all present in the county. It is therefore very important that we continue the spraying work, and keep the fruit trees free from the pest.
