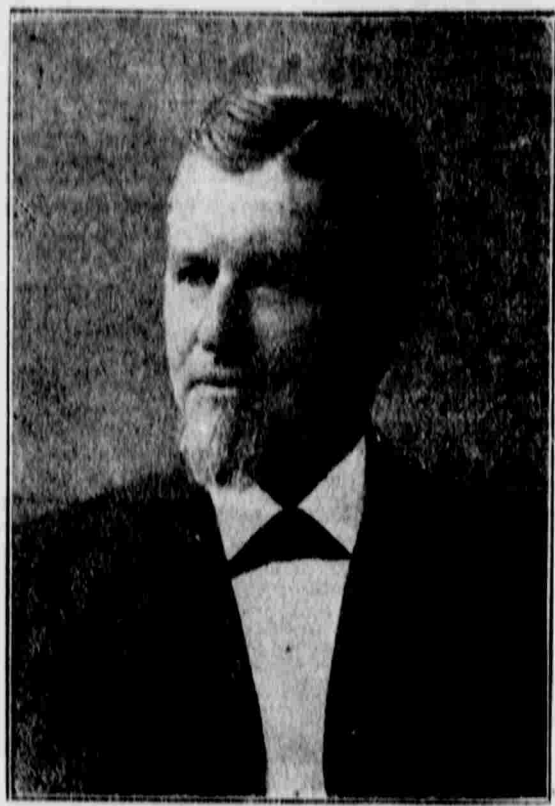


LEAVES FROM OLD ALBUMS.

Mrs. K. M. C. Meredith, author of "The Wings of Love," has for many years been deeply interested in psychical phenomena. Every unusual incident having a possible bearing on psychic matters she has had recorded and witnessed, and she has, consequently, a mass of authenticated and important data. Mrs. Meredith has a marked aptitude for writing fiction, as shown in "Drumstick," "The Wings of Love," and it is said that the near future will see a volume from her hand embodying in story form much of her experience of occult phenomena.

John Stuart Mill's library containing about 1,500 volumes in the cottage at Avignon where he lived from 1815 to the time of his death in 1873, was sold at public auction on May 21 to 23, and bought by Madame Roumanille, the widow of Joseph Roumanille, a publisher and bookseller, as well as poet and dramatist. The library contains many first editions of Carlyle, Spencer, Malraux, Darwin, Hume, etc., including many presentation copies, which are covered with Mill's annotations. There are three parts of Carlyle, made up from Fraser's Magazine, there is a "Pickering Catalogue" filled with marks and underlinings, and there are a considerable number of manuscripts, some of them containing the first drafts of his books, and in company with Jack London, she often rides horseback over the county roads. She sometimes contributes to various magazines.

London has a bungalow near Glen Ellen, where he does much of his writing. At present he is at work on a serial story for the Harpers. The new property he has acquired was held at a high figure, but London took it at the price asked.

Funk & Wagnalls company will publish shortly "The Preparation of Manuscripts for the Printer," by Frank H. Vint, formerly associate editor of the Standard Dictionary. Besides giving directions to authors on how to prepare copy and correct proofs, Mr. Vint's work points out how authors can effectively reduce the cost of their books, and tells them where and how to make such corrections.

The recent additions to the store of manuscripts in the Bibliotheque Nationale at Paris are now at the service of students. They comprise the papers of Zola, the correspondence of George Sand and Musset, the manuscript of the letters of Madame de Staël to Pauline, the Marlette papers, the correspondence and many other papers of Thiers, and the manuscript account of a voyage to the United States by the Duc de Rochefoucauld-Liancourt.

The late Lady Dilke, one of the most brilliant women of her time, was not, as has been often stated, the original of Dorothea Brooke, in "Middlemarch." But it is the case, her husband says, that the religious side of that character was modeled on George Eliot from the letters of the girl, who was then Mrs. Mark Pattison. There was American blood in her writer, for she was the daughter of Samuel Strong of Augusta, Ga. Her maiden name was Emily Francis Strong.

Nobody knows where there will be found any authentic biography of the author of "Lorna Doone" in the letters devoted to letters. Blackmore left with his representatives directions which forbid access to his papers, and would naturally have no value. The novelist's life was so secluded and uneventful that an account of it could not be made interesting without the letters and other personal documents which are beyond the reach of the literary "grabber."

In her South African romance entitled "On the Firing Line," Anna Chaplin has a collaborator, Hamilton Brock Fuller. Mr. Fuller is a Canadian who grew up just in time to be in the field during the last 18 months of the Boer war, yet he was in two of the more important engagements of that later period. With the South African Horse, he fought and was wounded at Vlakfontein, and, nearly a year later, he was with the South African Light Horse during Lord Kitchener's famous drive at Wolskehoek.

Mrs. Ray is an indefatigable literary worker, who scored her first success as the author of a juvenile story, "Teddy's Her Book." Since her first book was published by Little, Brown & Co., she has written almost constantly. Besides her "Teddy" stories she has written three novels, "East of Eden," "The Dominant Strain," and "By the Good Saline Anne." A new edition of the latter book—a romance of Middle Ages—has just been published, with many full-page plates of scenes in and around Quebec. In "On the Firing

annual pension of £300 granted him some five years before he was made post-laureate. "Richard Milnes," said Carlyle one day to Lord Houghton, withdrawing his pipe from his mouth, "they were seated together in the little house in Cheyne Row, when you were going to get that pension for Alfred Tennyson." My dear Carlyle," responded Milnes, "the thing is not so easy as you seem to suppose. What will my constituents say if I do get the pension for Tennyson? They know nothing about him or his poetry, and they will probably think he is some poor relation of my own, and that the whole affair is a job." Solemn and emphatic was Carlyle's response. "Richard Milnes, on the day of judgment, when the Lord asks you why you didn't get that pension for Alfred Tennyson, it will not do to lay the blame on your constituents. It is you that will be damned." As a matter of fact, Lord Houghton took a great deal of trouble in bringing the poet's claims before Sir Robert Peel, who had the previous knowledge of his work. He read the "Ode" out aloud to him, and the pension was immediately secured.

At last M. Rostand has finished the new play on which he has been at work ever since he wrote "L'Aiglon." He has been paying a flying visit to Paris from his residence in Cannes, and took the completed manuscript with him. "Chanteclair" is its title and the name of its hero. All the characters are new. It was known from the beginning, Coquelin the elder will be Chanteclair himself, and Paris will be "Coco," as his friends call him, playing the cock of the walk. The lovely and noble Mlle. Simonne will be the blackbird, Madame Simonee is Barre, full of life, may be the chirping quail, and the periquet will be imperious and a clever actress, Madame Augustine Lerche.

There are as many as 50 characters in the piece, all feathered. It is not surprising that the play, which is satirical in an Aristophanean vein, "Chanteclair" will be brought out by M. Coquelin as his second novelty next season, after a drama, "L'Attentat," for which two very different writers, MM. Alfred Capus and Yvonne Deshayes have collaborated. M.
