SILVER PLUME.

All Hands are Busily Digging Out the Dead.

EIGHT BODIES RECOVERED.

Many People Living in Cabins are Hurrying Out to Escape a Snow Slide.

Denver, Colo., Feb. 12.—A special to the Times from Silver Plume, Colo., says:

Many people living in cabins on the mountain slide are moving today. In order to avoid possible death in snow slides, such as that which swept down Chrysomel canyon yesterday killing at least ten persons, many heavy masses of snow that had been down yesterday afternoon in the mountain slide are being taken down today.

At present, the bodies of the missing men who are buried away in the avalanche of yesterday are still being recovered.

For eight bodies have been recovered. Three men, who were caught in the slide, were taken out with only their heads and feet exposed.

It is thought that thirty persons were in the slide. Possibly a dozen more were taken out, but those who were left in the canyon are anxious to give information. Two men who were in the slide were taken out, but they were unable to get out of the way of the moving mass of snow. The known men are:
