TRAPS FOR GOPHERS.

As for the real gophers, that mostly nte in ditch banks or on banks of mater canals, the trap is the easiest method of getting rid of them. Their mber is generally limited, although e damage they inflict is often great. the gophers get too plentiful for your s, dust some pieces of carrots with pieces into each hole. Cut the pieces carots from one-half to three-fourths an inch in size, before dusting them. his method is, however, dangerous, as plece of poisoned carrot may lie in sopher hole for three to four months solar note for three to four months dithen be pushed out and swallowed stock or by children, therefore the most care should be taken, and the ethod not to be followed except in ume necessity.
