

## PRESIDENT CLARK TO INSPECT LINE.

Will Arrive Here Tomorrow and Meet With Messrs. Cornish And Bancroft.

### SPECIAL TRAIN ON SATURDAY.

J. Ross Clark Came in Today to be Present at Meeting Prior To the Opening.

J. Ross Clark, vice president of the San Pedro, Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad company, arrived in this city at 9:45 this morning from Los Angeles. He was accompanied by Atty. C. O. Whittemore, who went down to Las Vegas to meet him and spent a couple of days at that place looking over the proposed townsite and making arrangements to file the necessary maps and data prior to the opening.

Mr. Clark is here to meet his brother, President W. A. Clark of the road, who arrives from Butte tomorrow morning, to meet with Messrs. Cornish and Bancroft of the Harriman interests, when arrangements will be made in relation to the opening of the road. All parties will meet in the Oregon Short Line board rooms tomorrow, and the following day will board a special train and go down to Los Angeles, thoroughly inspecting the property en route.

All work will be put in hand at the depot buildings, station tanks and coal chutes in order that things may be in good shape for the opening of the road for through traffic. It will be some weeks, however, before the entire road is turned over to the operating department by the construction engineers.

If present plans are followed, there will be one train through each way daily. Coming westward, the train will leave Los Angeles at 7:30 p.m., and arrive in Salt Lake at 6:30 a.m. on the second day. Going west the time of departure from Salt Lake will be 8:30 p.m., arriving at Los Angeles at 7:30 on the morning of the second day. The first class passenger fare will be \$30; unlimited, \$35, with Pullman rate of \$5.50.

### CONDUCTOR KILLED.

Ben Wood of Salt Lake Route Met Death Near Milford.

The body of Ben Wood, who was killed near Milford yesterday afternoon, was brought in from the south this morning. Deceased was a conductor on an extra work train on the Salt Lake Route. He was between two cars at a point about 12 miles north of Milford yesterday, when he was crushed. He was at once taken to Milford, but expired shortly after arriving there.

Injunction Suit On.

Action by Local Hardware Company Continued Till April 28.

The bearing on the order to show cause why an injunction should not be issued in the base of the Brubaker-Campbell Hardware company against C. E. Brubaker and the National Bank of the Republic was on before Judge Morse this morning but was not completed. A continuance was taken until April 28.

The injunction is asked to restrain defendants from selling 73 shares of stock of the plaintiff company which was given by Brubaker to the bank as security for a loan. The complaint alleges that Brubaker has circulated false reports concerning plaintiff company to the effect that its stock was not worth 50 cents on the dollar, and that it was insolvent. It is also alleged that it was said he would break the company up, and that he told traveling men not to sell it any goods on account of its insolvency.
