

GRANT MONUMENT.

How the Money Necessary Was Raised for the New Tomb.

A MAGNIFICENT WORK OF ART.

Description of the Last Resting Place of America's Immortal Hero.

It was by popular subscription that the fund necessary for the erection of the tomb of General Grant was raised, and it is estimated that 90,000 people contributed some ranging from one cent to \$5,000.



GENERAL ULYSSES S. GRANT. Born April 27, 1822. Died July 23, 1885.

Grant, on the 25th of July, 1884, New York City having been suggested by General Grant before his death as the place for his burial, William H. Grant, then mayor, called a meeting of the city board to take steps towards the collection of a fund for the erection of a national monument.

The first object is a site and is considered intractable. It is six feet long and the outer case of cedar is covered with black marble. The interior is copper, highly polished, and is one-eighth of an inch thick.

With the year following the erection of the Grant monument, associations were formed and articles were requested to submit designs for a monumental tomb, but because of the general desire to obtain a design which would be once be a work of art, picturesque to the popular eye, and durable enough to last through the ages, great care was taken and ideas and plans were obtained from every standpoint.

WHERE THE TOMB STANDS. Riverside Park is, indeed, a fitting place for the tomb of a hero. Not only is the location of the tomb in a park, but the view from the river is a picture of grandeur.
