electricity at a continuous rate in uniform quantity, while it

neutralizes the influence of the current. A simple apparatus regulates

the carbon, and the light thus produced is intensified by passing

through a chamber in which the light moves on pivots and

condenses the rays, producing a far more brilliant light than the
