Colorado Track Team to Contest With University of Utah Boys.

TOMORROW AFTERNOON, 3 P. M.

Leading Athletes of the Two States Will Then Settle the Question of Superiority.

On Cumming's field, beginning at 3 o'clock tomorrow afternoon, the long-talented meet between the Colorado College and U. of U. track teams, will take place.

The visiting athletes held the proud distinction of being the very best in the neighboring state. They have met and defeated all the other crack teams of Colorado.

They have gone through the season thus far without a defeat being chalked up against them. The Denver papers say that the Colorado Springs team is the best that ever competed in a state meet, and that is saying a great deal.

It cannot be disputed that the present "variety" team is the best institution ever had. Take for instance the four runners—Whitney, Moore, Wado and Rideout. They are undoubtedly the fastest men in the state.

One event that is sure to attract great interest, will be the 100 yard dash. Colorado has a record of 19.1. Whitney of the "variety" established a record of 19 seconds.

Both teams hold many records for their respective states, and the following comparison will be interesting to those who are concerned in tomorrow afternoon's meet:

100 yard dash—Colorado 26 seconds; Utah 23 seconds. 200 yard dash—Colorado 1:04 seconds; Utah 1:02 seconds.
