RUNAWAYS.—Runaways on the streets of the city have now become a matter of every day's occurrence, and in most cases the person or property of some individual or another. The cause of nearly all runaways is self-evident. In walking down any of the main thoroughfares almost any person may see a dozen or more of teams not attached to any hitching post, and the owners nowhere to be seen.

Now these runaways are really dangerous to the public, and we think their frequency not creditable to the city, especially as, in the case of some of the teams, the owners are not attached to any hitching post, and the first mistake made in the leaving of unattended, unhitched teams on the streets punishable by law. We cannot at present recollect a case where this provision has been enforced. This is a beneficial ordinance when applied, but like everything else of the kind, it is so easily good as a dead letter.

Use of the connection with the matter is to be considered, and that is, if the owners of teams are required to hitch their teams unattended unless the latter are attached to a hitching post, the post must be there to hitch to, or the ordinance cannot be complied with. The first mistake made in the prevention of those dangerous and almost daily occurrences, therefore, is in the placing of all necessary points suitable posts. When that is done, the ordinance with regard to unattended teams on the streets can be constantly and strictly enforced. We do not see how it can well be before this is done.
