THE ALBANY BRIDGES.

ALBANY, N. Y., June 23.—Dingus,

assistant president of the New York

the packages. Witness knew Roscoe

Conkling, didn't think the New

York Central was interested in the

caucus. Platt is an official of the

Southern Central Road.

Chas. P. Ingersoll, of Westfield,

testified: I have been here four

weeks in the interest of Dewey and

the administration. Have known

Sessions four or five years. Bradley

only knew me last night. June

8th, supposed Bradley would vote

for Dewey. Never paid him any

money; saw nobody pay him.

Bradley told me his constituents

expected Conkling and

Platt, and he was through voting

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
