Fire and Loss of Life on a Mysterious
Steamship.

New Orleans, 30.—Pleasure
steamer, the *Vicksburg*, which left
at 3 o'clock fire broke out on the
steamer *R. E. Lee*, while on a trip
to this place, about 30 miles below
here, resulting in the total destruc-
tion of the boat with terrible loss of
life. The following is the list of
passengers known to be lost:

Cabin passengers: Mr. Point
Maryville, Ky.; Mrs. McClellan,
New Orleans; Miss Adams, music
teacher, on her way to Baton Rouge;
an infant of Mrs. Seale, of "Vick-
burg, and two colored women. Also
the following: Frank Jones, fireman;
Aphelia Jones and Martha Webb,
second and third chambermaids;
Thomas Fisher, Joe Murrell, Scott
Cox, Thomas Collins, J. Duncan,
cabin boys; Samuel Brown, roust-
about; Karlo, carpenter; Wm. West-
maker, second engineer; all the
cooks and help except the pastry
cook. The books of the boat and the
United States mail are lost together
with a cargo of five hundred barrels of
cotton.

The *Lee* had just been overhauled
and newly painted, and was on
her first trip this season. She left
Vicksburg yesterday evening for
New Orleans, bound for the
Louisiana shore and landed,
at Location Plantation thirty-five
miles below Vicksburg. In a few
minutes she was completely en-
veloped in flame. Twenty-one persons
are believed to be lost, including
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
