

## LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

**THEATRE.**—Last evening Mr. Chaplin made his first appearance before a Salt Lake audience in the character of "Hamlet." The attendance was very fair, considering the attraction now presented by Castello's circus, and afforded abundant proof that the love of the legitimate drama is still strong in our midst. The rendition of the character of the unhappy Dane by Mr. Chaplin was very good, his reading of some passages being excellent. He was ably supported by the company. The greater portion of our young people have never had the opportunity of seeing wild beasts or really fine circus performance. To such Dan Castello's circus and menagerie present many attractions, and they may visit the leading cities of the world and see no better performances than his offers.

This popular troupe performed again last night before a large and enthusiastic audience. This is the first time the people have had the pleasure of witnessing a really first class circus and they turned out in full force, the immense canvass being so crowded that many were obliged to stand. It was estimated that twenty-five hundred people were present, from whom the large fees of horsemanship, the wonderfully trained animals, and the witicism of the clown elicited round after round of applause.
