had had occasion to study us as a people; knew something of our history in the States, of our leaving the States and coming over those vast and then uninhabited and unproductive plains, consecrating our lives to the ideas we had espoused, and that all along that trackless waste and those snowy mountains there are the unmarked graves of thousands of our people. "The people of this country should feel under great obligations to you. You came to this Territory at a time when it belonged to the sister republic of Mexico. The war of '46-7 annexed you to the United States, and for this demonstration which I have witnessed to-day, on behalf of the loyal people of the United States, I thank you.

Driven forth from Illinois and Missouri you sought a shelter and home in a foreign land. After you had established the foundation of what now bids fair to be a mighty power, you became, by the fortunes of war, attached again to the United States; and under its jurisdiction, it affords me pleasure to see you conforming to the necessity of things, keeping as best you may the laws under which you live, and to hear uttered here to-day sentiments such as every true American must say Amen to."

Of course he did not come here to make a 4th of July oration, but simply to look at this Territory, which for six years he has had charge of as Chairman of the Committee on Territories in the House of Representatives, with the other Territories. He expected to return this way to the east; meantime he hoped to become acquainted with our leading and distinguished citizens, as with the leading men of the other Territories, that he might know and understand our wants better than he could do at a distance.

He spoke in complimentary terms of our delegates during the past six years; and concluded with, "Whatever may be our peculiar views, let us maintain the principles of the Declaration that has just been read and the oration that has been pronounced, and make this nation what it ought to be, the freest, mightiest and most glorious on the earth."

J. D. T. McAllister, Esq., sang a song, chorussed by the D. M. A., after which the Hon. Geo. A. Smith proposed Hon. W. H. Hooper as next delegate for Congress. A vote was taken which was unanimous. Mr. Hooper briefly responded. A number of toasts were then read, which we have not space for. Col. J. C. Little thanked the people in behalf of the Mayor and City Council for their promptness in uniting in the exercises of the day, and the interest they had manifested. Benediction by the Chaplain concluded the proceedings, at 12 m. precisely, when the vast multitude quietly dispersed.

Thirty-five guns at noon and three at sundown closed the official proceedings of the day.

The committee deserve much commendation for their admirable arrangements, and the promptitude and order with which they were carried out.

We saw no person the worse of liquor, heard no one blaspheme, and witnessed nothing but good order, peace and happiness throughout the entire day. The afternoon was generally spent as a holiday, winding up with Uncle Tom's Cabin at the Theatre, which was numerously attended.
