HARBORS DESTROYED BY FIRE.

Not Death in Laramie, Wyoming, City Jail - A. Beckman Killing, Etc.

The town of Laramie, W. Y., was the scene of a tragedy on Monday night, when a woman, Mrs. A. Beckman, was killed in the city jail. The woman was found lying on the floor of the jail, and was pronounced dead by the coroner. The coroner's jury returned a verdict of death, and the body was buried in the city cemetery.

The Laramie Herald, a local newspaper, has been destroyed by fire. The building, which was a two-story structure, was completely consumed by the flames. The loss is estimated at \$10,000. The fire broke out on Monday night, and the building was found to be a total ruin.

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
