Revision of the Bible
The revision of the Bible was the subject treated yesterday afternoon by the Rev. Dr. Phillip Schaff, at the church of the Epiphany. After sketching the history of the translation of the Bible, the speaker reviewed the progress in favor of a revision, as follows:
The present English Bible is the outcome of half a dozen revisions, extending through three generations of church history; yet the English language has changed, not as much as in earlier periods, yet enough to demand the attention of Biblical interpreters. The meaning of words has varied; in the phrase "I thought," the thought is not the same as it was in the original; "I thought" formerly meant "I intended," and now means "I intended." To let the English reader understand the meaning of the Greek and its prophecies, it is often necessary to refer to the original. The original Bible has been often before the eyes of the people. Words of different meaning in the original are often translated in the same way. The original Bible knows no such thing as "I thought," "I intended," or "I intended." The real value of Scriptural words and measures are known. In conclusion Mr. Schaff spoke briefly of the progress which has been made in the work of revision in Germany, France, England and America. The verses and chapters are arranged into paragraphs and proper divisions, and the sacred poetry, which fills one-third of the Bible, is taking a proper poetical form. Dr. Schaff expressed the hope that within three or four years the work will be finished. The English work will be revised by Americans, and the American work will be revised by Englishmen. By this means it is hoped that a Bible acceptable to English speaking people will be obtained.
Sea Serpents.
The gigantic whale captured in February last in the Gulf of Taranto, Italy, has been subjected to a critical examination by Prof. Capellini, who, in a report lately published, states it as his opinion that the whole is of a species hitherto unknown to science, and he has named it balæno, in allusion to the locality of its capture. This unlooked for discovery of a new species of huge marine animal, taken in connection with the alleged appearance of another "monster" shortly later, and in the same neighborhood, has vouched for by the officers of the royal yacht, has been regarded as a strong argument in favor of the existence of unknown huge marine living objects, such as are popularly indicated by the name of sea-serpents. The opinion is gaining ground in Italy that the sea serpent of the royal yacht was some creature usually living at the bottom of the sea, but disturbed by the volcanic phenomena. - London Times.

POSTAL AFFAIRS
Rates of Domestic Postage
LETTERS - The standard single rate is 3 cents per 100 words, but for letters exceeding 100 words the rate is 4 cents per 100 words. For each additional 100 words the rate is 1 cent. Drop letters, containing not more than 100 words, are charged at the rate of 3 cents. Newspapers and periodicals - The postage on newspapers and periodicals is paid at the office of publication. Newspapers are not charged postage when mailed to subscribers in the same county where the paper is published. Foreign newspapers, not exceeding 100 words, are charged postage at the rate of 4 cents per 100 words. The maximum weight of any package, of printed or miscellaneous matter is 10 pounds.
Registered Letters and Money Orders
Registered letters may be registered on payment of 1 cent of the cost of the letter, and the postage is paid at the office of the postmaster. Money orders are charged postage at the rate of 1 cent per 100 words. On orders not exceeding \$10, the postage is 1 cent. On orders not exceeding \$20, the postage is 2 cents. On orders not exceeding \$50, the postage is 5 cents. On orders not exceeding \$100, the postage is 10 cents. On orders not exceeding \$200, the postage is 20 cents. On orders not exceeding \$500, the postage is 50 cents. On orders not exceeding \$1000, the postage is 1 dollar. On orders not exceeding \$2000, the postage is 2 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$5000, the postage is 5 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$10000, the postage is 10 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$20000, the postage is 20 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$50000, the postage is 50 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$100000, the postage is 100 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$200000, the postage is 200 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$500000, the postage is 500 dollars. On orders not exceeding \$1000000, the postage is 1000 dollars.
